JOB DESCRIPTION

Role Purpose:

The purpose of this role is to provide efficient administrative and organisational support to the SENDCO team.

Key Accountabilities:

Reporting to the SENDCO/Deputy Headteacher, this post holder will be accountable for

- Reviewing SEND data/census information on SIMS and the SEND register
- Submitting annual review statutory paperwork in accordance with statutory guidelines and deadlines
- Attending relevant meetings as required, take minutes and circulate to relevant attendees and agencies.
- Supporting EAL and new intake pupils with logins
- Overseeing staff and pupil logins for a wide range of online testing resources
- Supporting transition and requesting relevant documentation from primary schools as required
- Liaison and submission of referrals to external agencies and ensuring in line with required timelines
- Providing administrative and organisational support for PCP meetings for EHCP submissions

Undertake any other duties appropriate to the grade of the post as requested by your Line Manager
